<u>Circular 26: SNAKES</u> 09/12/2015

Mr Binneman, one of your homeowners, sent me the e-mail below about snakes and he requested that I inform all Homeowners about the issue of snakes. It is written in Afrikaans and I translated the important information for those who do not do Afrikaans.

Contact Mr Theard, The Snake Catcher when you find a snake on your property. FRANCOIS THEARD CELL NO; 081 290 0343

Please save his name and number on your cellphone.

Mr Theard does not charge for catching snakes but he does accept a donation for his work. I suggest that he be paid an amount of N\$200.00 for his trouble to keep you safe.

- Please DO NOT kill the snake.
- Leave the serpent alone.
- Remove yourself from the environment.
- If he is in your house, close the doors and isolate him in the room that he is in.

What follows below is a guideline for managing snakes and snake bites on your property

There are NO effective snake repellents

- 1. Avoid storing building material such as bricks, pipes and sheets of iron near the house.
 - a. Fitting a rolled up piece of chicken mesh, or a ball made of plastic into the opening of a pipe may stop the snake of going in there.

- 2. Avoid compost heaps, rockeries, aviaries, chicken coops, fish ponds and loose rocks as they may provide a source of food or a hiding spots for snakes.
 - a. If you need to have a compost heap, again you can close it up with chicken mesh securely anchored to the ground without spaces for the snake to get in.
 - b. A rockery is a nice feature to have but if you have to work there, wear shoes, socks a long sleeved shirt and thick plastic gloves.
- 3. Avoid planting creepers, thick hedges and shrubs especially against house walls and open windows.
 - a. If you do have creepers, hedges and shrubs it may be a good idea to first poke into them with a looooong stick if you think there may be a snake in it.
- 4. Store animal feed in rat proof containers. Note all buildings should be kept rat free. Where there are rats there are going to be snakes.
- 5. Close off all of the cracks/holes where snakes might fit through.
 - a. A good product to use is the foam crack filler.
- 6. Keep doors and windows closed during the day as many snakes seek shelter.
 - a. It is advised to fit a fly screen or two inside your windows for fresh air.

What to do in case you encounter a snake:

- 1. Please DO NOT try to kill the snake as this may result in a bite!
 - a. Snakes, left alone, will quietly go on their daily business.
 - b. It will not charge at you if it does not feel threatened.
- 2. Any reptile will get aggressive if it is cornered. LEAVE THE THING ALONE!
- 3. Keep CALM!
 - a. Breathe in slowly.
 - b. Stand absolutely still! Most snakes will go away immediately.
 - c. If the snake stands its ground, retreat slowly.
 - d. Most snakes will not even know that you are there. If you just stand still, he will just go on his way where ever he was going.
 - e. For god's sake, do not scream or faint!
- 4. Contact your nearest snake catcher to deal with the situation.

Avoiding snakebite:

- 1. Wear proper clothing when walking in the veld preferably boots, long trousers and long sleeved shirts.
- 2. Wear sunglasses as this provides protection against spitting cobras.
- 3. As a rule, always wear long plastic gloves in the garden.
- 4. Watch your step. Rather step onto logs and rocks and not over them.
 - a. Avoid kicking logs and rocks around; the snake may be waiting for you under them.
- 5. Do not collect fire wood at dusk or at night that's looking for trouble.
 - a. We are in any case not allowed to collect fire wood at the Estate.
- 6. If you're a mountaineer be careful where you place your hands, as many snakes like to bask in the sun on the ledges.
- 7. Do not pick up any snake no matter how harmless it may seem.
- 8. Do not pick up what appears to be a dead snake, as some venomous species fake death.

9. Use flash light when walking at night and keep your eyes open.

10. Avoid walking in long grass.

Basic first aid:

- 1. Keep the victim calm and reassured.
- 2. Remove jewellery and tight clothing.
- 3. Victim must lie down and kept as still as possible.
- 4. Elevate limb and transport to Hospital.
- 5. Pressure bandages should ONLY be applied to Neuro toxic snake bites!! (Black Mamba, Cape Cobra and Anchietas Cobra)
- 6. If you cannot ID the snake apply a pressure bandage. Note this should obviously not be used for Spitting Cobras.
- 7. If victim stops breathing resort to mouth to mouth resuscitation.
 - a. (If the victim is a beautiful girl, you may do mouth to mouth resuscitation **<u>before</u>** she stops breathing)

DO NOT:

- 1. Do not cut or suck on the wound.
- 2. Do not apply tourniquet.
- 3. Do not apply ice or give the victim alcohol to drink.
 - a. You may take a tot to give you the courage to cope with the emergency!
- 4. Do not inject anti-venom as a first aid measure.

In case of venom in the eye:

- 1. Rinse it out with running water for 10-15min.
- 2. Avoid rubbing eyes.
- 3. Seek medical attention.

NB! Do not attempt to kill the snake rather take a picture from a safe distance for identification by medical personnel.
