### 1. Accounting Policies

The annual financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Namibian Generally Accepted Accounting Practice - NAC 001: Financial Reporting for Small and Medium Sized Entities. The following are the principal accounting policies of the association, The annual financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis and incorporate the following principal accounting policies:

## 1.1 Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment ( owned or leased ) is stated at historical cost less depreciation. Depreciation is calculated on the straight - line method to write off the cost to residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life as follows:

4 Years Vehicles 4 Years Equipment

In determining the recoverable amount of items of property, plant and equipment, expected future cash flows have not been discounted to their present values.

### 1.2 Levy receivables

Levy receivables are carried at original invoice amount less provision made for impairment of these receivables. Such provisions for impairment of levy receivables is established if there is objective evidence that the Association will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of receivables. Bad debts are written off during the year in which they are identified.

### 1.3 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are carried in the balance sheet at cost. For the purposes of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. In the balance sheet, bank overdrafts are included in borrowings in current liabilities.

#### 1.4 Trade payables

Trade payables are carried at the fair value of the consideration to be paid in future for goods or services that have been received or supplied and invoiced or formally agreed with the supplier.

### 1.5 Levies on owners

Levies charged to owners are recognised when accrued. Normal levy rates are determined by the Trustees of the Association at the Annual General Meeting, whilst special levies may be instituted by the Trustees.

## 1.6 Fair value of financial instruments

At 29 February 2016 the carrying amounts of cash and short-term deposits, levy accounts receivable, trade accounts payable and accrued expenses approximated fair values due to the short-term maturities of these assets and liabilities.
